





Tool to salvation through Jesus







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


Having saved us from the valley of death, Jesus expects of us to take up our own cross and live a life as He did on earth. Dying to ourselves and living for Jesus seems like the only way of really living.

Matthew 16:24-25 - Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it.



The love of Jesus binds us in a lifelong friendship with him, from now until eternity. We did nothing to deserve it! We just need to believe and accept that Jesus came to save us from the valley of death. Ephesians 2:8 - For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God.



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It saddens God that people don't experience friendship with him. He created the perfect plan and sent His only Son to come and live with us, to show us His love and to die on the cross for us. Our faith in him lifts us out of the valley of death and saves us from our sinful lives. John 3:16 - For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

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
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Pray with someone and ask Jesus to let you see Him next to you in the valley of death. Pray for the gift of faith to trust Him to change you to become a new person – a possession of God! Romans 10:13 - Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Jesus sees the Samaritan woman for who she is. He cares for her and addresses her needs. In the same way, Jesus wants to help you to view your reality in a different way – to #SEE yourself, your life and the world around you in a different way.

Symbol: Hashtag # to look through (against your eye)



John 4:5–26 Jesus SEES the Samaritan woman in a different way

- # What challenges, questions and "baggage" does the Samaritan woman have?
- # How does Jesus react to her?
- # How do you think other people see you?
- # How do you see yourself?
- # What do you "carry around with you" that holds you back? Things from you past? Challenges you faced or are still facing?
- # In verse 11 Jesus talks about living water what is "living water" and what does it mean to you?
- # In verse 18–19 Jesus shows her that He knows the truth about her, but He does not condemn her. What do you need to be honest about with Jesus?
- # In verse 23 Jesus teaches her about worship. He shows her his heart so that she can "see" Him for who He is. How do you view Jesus at the moment? What picture of Jesus do you have in your mind (with regard to his characteristics)?
- # Jesus' conversation with and acceptance of the woman helps her to see herself and Jesus differently. What were the circumstances you went through that made you realise Jesus sees you differently?



Bridge Builder

Jesus crosses several boundaries and builds a bridge towards the Samaritan woman. He does this lovingly by engaging in conversation in a spirit of friendship. This story calls us to be bridge builders just like Jesus – we need to cross the boundaries of our time.

Symbol: Hashtag # made by 2 people with 2 fingers each Decide to cross a bridge this week by having a conversation with someone who needs it.

John 4:5–26 *Jesus BUILDS A BRIDGE through his conversation with the Samaritan woman*

- # Which boundaries does Jesus cross by having this conversation with this woman? Name at least 4.
- # What boundaries do you recognise and think we need to cross in our day-to-day life today? Name all the examples you can think of.
- # Think of someone you know who is building bridges across differences and divides in order to get to know someone else who needs a friend?
- # Which boundaries (age, gender, language, culture, race, class, social group, etc) are the easiest for you to cross?
- # Which boundaries are the most difficult for you to cross?
- # Where, when and how can you start with a bridge-building conversation?
- # What do you think will help you to cross a bridge over the boundaries that divides people because of their differences? In other words, what will help you make contact and connect with someone else?
- # What do you think are the things we need to remember when we have bridge-building conversations?



The Samaritan woman became a witness in her village when she told(TELL) everyone about her conversation with Jesus. You are being challenged to take up your cross in your identity in Christ, follow Him and TELL your story to others. He wants to share his heart for the world with you. You can influence your "village" and make a difference.



John 4:27-30, 39-42 The Samaritan woman TELL other about her meeting with Jesus

- # The woman had a reputation that isolated her from her village. What makes it hard for you to testify as a witness of Christ?
- # Still the woman goes back to the village with great enthusiasm and she tells every one about Jesus and what He did for her. What do you think caused the change?
- # What do Jesus' cross and His resurrection mean to you?
- # Jesus calls us to be cross bearers. What does this mean?
- # The #imagine movement will stand or fall by the way in which YOU will go back to your "village" to go and testify. What will motivate you to do this? What will make it difficult for you?
- # How does Jesus help you to be a witness(TELL)?
- # Who does the term "village" include? In other words, who can you influence?
- # Who are the first 3 people you are going to TELL?







Other people see what Jesus does (verse 7)

- # Why did the people who saw this, react negatively?
- # How do you relate to this? What does it tell you about the way you look at other people?



What prevents you to SEE Jesus in your life?






- # What are your needs?
- # When you hear: "Be courageous. Stand up. He is calling you," what does it mean to you?

Jesus heals his blindness (verse 52)

- # In what ways are people symbolically blind?
- # How does Jesus heal people from their blindness today?
- # What was Bartimaues' reaction?
- # Have you ever felt your eyes open in certain circumstances or relation to specific people? In what way and/or for whom?
- # What can you do to help people "to open their eyes"?

Jesus Blesses Little Children (Mark 10: 13-16) Read the text twice Discuss the following questions:

The children are brought to Jesus

- # What did people think of children in the time of the Bible?
- # What kind of people are looking down on others today? Who are the outcasts according to the world today? Who are viewed as inferior people?
- # Why did some people bring their children to Jesus?
- # Why did the disciples try to chase them away?
- # Why was Jesus so indignant about it?
- # How do you think Jesus looks at the outcasts of society and people who are viewed and treated as inferior by other people?

Get involved somewhere where you can help children in some way.



Jesus blesses the children

- # Jesus put his arms around the children. He placed his hands on them and blessed them. What does it mean to YOU that Jesus puts his arms around you, that He places his hands on you and blesses you?
- # What are the implications of this to you and the manner in which you interact with your family and people in your school, church or town?

Who are the "children" in your life? (In other words, the people who are being pushed aside or seen as inferior)?






- # Why do you think Jesus wants us to be "bridge builders"?
- # Make a list of people or groups that you usually ignore?
- # How can you build a bridge towards them?

How can you show God's love to people who feel that they are to far removed from God?

Do your words to other people build them up or break them down?



Jesus calls Levi (Mark 2: 13-17)


Read the text twice

Discuss the following questions:

Jesus calls Levi

- # What is a tax collector?
- # Why is it strange that Jesus chose a tax collector as a disciple?
- # What kind of people do you view as the "Christian type" and who do you think would never make the cut to be a disciple? How does this story challenge your preconceived ideas on discipleship?
- # What does Jesus think of Levi (and other outcasts) who can be viewed as "unholy"?





- # Why is Jesus criticised for this?
- # In what way is Jesus' love and acceptance of people an example to you?
- # Who can you think of as always being excluded?
- # How can you befriend them?



Are you someone who excludes some people?
Or do you feel excluded?



On the road
to Emmaus
(Luke 24:13-35)
Read the text twice
Discuss the following questions:

The conversation about the cross

- # Do you know someone who has heard the story of Jesus, his cross and crucifixion, but still does not understand the real meaning of it?
- # What questions do people you know have about Jesus, the cross and faith?
- # How can you start a conversation with them (like Jesus did)?




Write down how Jesus influenced your life and share it with someone



- # Why did the men run all the way back that evening?
- # To whom did the Spirit send you to tell your story?
- # What are your challenges and/or excuses? Pray about this.



Everyone has a story. What is yours? How can you testify about what Jesus has done for you? What can you testify about how He is still working in your life every day?





How does the Holy Spirit help you to be a witness of God's grace and testify about it?




Women tell
of the resurrection
(Matt 28: 1-10)
Read the text twice
Discuss the following questions:

The angel appears

- # How do you think the women felt when the angel appeared to them?
- # What does the fact that Jesus was resurrected mean to you?
- # What does the angel tell the women? Which words are very important?
- # How can the #imagine words "#see", "#bridge builder", "#tell (carry the cross)" help you to tell others about your #imagine experience?





- #imagine experience? What will your reaction to it (deeds) be?
- # How will it impact your actions in the world around you?
- # Who can you tell about what you heard and experienced?

Jesus appeared to the women

- # Jesus gave the women (and the disciples) a command as well as a promise. What was it?
- # What is the specific promise that Jesus gave you through this experience?

What to do back home after #Imagine 2016

- # Take your own church's minister / pastor / youth worker for coffee.

- # Make contact and build a relationship with someone from a different culture.



INDEX FINGER – finger used to point direction Pray for people who give direction – teachers, parents, church leaders

MIDDLE FINGER - longest finger
Pray for the people in "high" positions eg government

RING FINGER – weakest finger
Pray for people who are "weak" – children, sick people, poverty


LITTLE FINGER – Pinky finger
Pray for yourself and your own needs

PALM – open your hands, palms facing upwards
Take time to be still and listen to God, open yourself up to Him

FIST – close your hand in a fist as if holding something
Take time to remember the promises of God and put your trust in Him
