Every year on the same weekend, there are three experiences (camps) at three different venues, where we learn more about Jesus, praise His name and get to know other young people from different communities all around South Africa.

HOW DO I USE THIS BOOKLET?

Welcome to this special booklet, created to help you continue your faith journey during and after the #imagine experience. The first pages of this booklet will guide you through the sessions during the #Imagine experience weekend. Thereafter you will find another 16 Bible studies that you can do alone or with a group to continue growing in your faith.

During the #imagine experience, we will focus on the story of Jesus and the Samaritan at the well in John 4. This story will challenge you to also make waves, like the woman, and to share Jesus' living water (hope and love) with others.

THEREFORE THE THEME IS - MAKE WAVES! AND THE CHALLENGE OF THE EXPERIENCE IS - BRING "HOPE TO OTHERS = H20".

JOHN 4:1-30 & 39-42 (NIV)

1 Now Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard that he was gaining and baptizing more disciples than John— 2 although in fact it was not Jesus who baptized, but his disciples. 3 So he left Judea and went back once more to Galilee.

4 Now he had to go through Samaria. 5 So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. 6 Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon.

7 When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" 8 His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. 9 The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.

10 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and **he would have given you living water**."

11 "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? 12 Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?"

13 Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, **14 but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst.** Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

15 The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."

16 He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back." 17 "I have no husband," she replied. Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband.

JESUS AND THE SAMARITAN WOMAN

18 The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true."

19 "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. 20 Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."

21 "Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. 22 You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. 23 Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. 24 God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth."

25 The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us."

26 Then Jesus declared, "I, the one speaking to you—I am he."27 Just then his disciples returned and were surprised to find him talking with a woman. But no one asked, "What do you want?" or "Why are you talking with her?"

28 Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to the town and said to the people, 29 "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" 30 They came out of the town and made their way toward him.

39 Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me everything I ever did." 40 So when the Samaritans came to him, they urged him to stay with them, and he stayed two days. 41 And because of his words many more became believers. 42 They said to the woman, "We no longer believe just because of what you said; now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the Savior of the world."

SESSION 1: THIRST! (FRIDAY EVENING)

READ JOHN 4:1-18, 26-27

John 4:13-14

Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will **never thirst**. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

GROUP QUESTIONS:

- Name 3 things that are important to you.
- What do people on social media or your peers **thirst** (crave) the most for?
- What do you think the Samaritan woman thought and felt meeting Jesus?

MAIN POINT:

The Samaritan woman's story is our story. Like this woman, we all thirst for attention, love and success. But worldly things won't satisfy our deepest thirst. Jesus also gives you the invitation – meet Him and never be thirsty again!

ENCOUNTERS:

JESUS IS OUR SAVIOR KING, DELIVERER, HEALER, FRIEND, TEACHER, HELPER. PEACE-MAKER AND IGNITER!

SESSION 2: DRINK! (SATURDAY MORNING)

READ JOHN 4: 10, 19-26

John 4:10 (The Message)

Jesus answered, "If you knew the generosity of God and who I am, you would be asking me for a **drink**, and I would give you fresh, living water."

GROUP QUESTIONS:

- Share something about one of the encounter stations you visited last night.
- What would you ask Jesus if you had coffee (or a water) with Him?
- What labels have others given you?

MAIN POINT:

Jesus answers the Samaritan woman's questions and teaches her that the labels others give us (or we give ourselves) are not important. He knows the real you, and loves you. He wants a relationship with you and He wants you to "drink" from His living water – life in abundance.

SESSION 3: SHARE! (SATURDAY EVENING)

READ JOHN 4:27-30, 39

John 4: 39

39 Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the **woman's testimony**...

GROUP QUESTIONS:

- Tell your group about one of the workshops you attended today.
- Share a story of someone who influenced your life.
- Why do you think the Samaritan woman went back to her town?
- What has surprised you in this story so far?

MAIN POINT:

One conversation with Jesus completely changed the Samaritan woman's life. She was an outcast, ashamed and lonely, but became a willing witness – sharing her story so that others may also experience Jesus' love and forgiveness. Jesus calls you to share your story and your gifts in the same way.

ENCOUNTERS:

JESUS CALLS YOU TO SHARE, SET FREE, HEAL, BEFRIEND. TEACH. SERVE. MAKE PEACE AND IGNITE!

SESSION 4: MAKE WAVES! (SUNDAY MORNING)

READ JOHN 4:39-42

John 4: 42b

... now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the **Savior of the world**."

GROUP QUESTIONS:

- Where did you meet Jesus this weekend?
- Which encounter station inspired you last night?
- How did Jesus speak to you through the story of the Samaritan woman?
- What are you thankful for?
- What are you worried about when going home?

MAIN POINT:

The story of the Samaritan woman challenges us to be a part of God's plan. He has a dream for South Africa and He wants to use you to **make** waves in your home, school, church and community. Share Jesus living water "H20 - Hope 2 Others" and know that He will always be with you.

DREAM - BELIEVE - DO!

H20 = HOPE TO OTHERS!



SAVIOR KING

READ LUKE 2:8-20
"THIS VERY DAY IN DAVID'S TOWN
YOUR SAVIOUR WAS BORN CHRIST THE LORD."

CHAT:

- Read the story and imagine you were one of the shepherds. What do you see? Feel? Think? Do?
- How did the shepherds' lives change after this encounter with God?
- In verse 11 the angel calls Jesus the Savior and Christ the Lord. What do these two titles mean?

THINK:

- Circle all the words that describe emotions in verses 8-14. Which of these emotions do you experience at the moment?
- How does Jesus impact your emotions and life story?

MAKE WAVES:

We see a world where everyone experiences Jesus' love. Did you know of the total national population of roughly 62 million, 52.8 million or 85.3% of South Africans, identifies as members of a Christian denomination. Imagine what we can do if every Christian proclaims Jesus as the Saviour-King?

- Choose words or short sentences which mean something to you.
 Combine it with a photo or background and share on Instagram or Facebook. Be creative.
- Pray by name for someone, for a whole week, who needs to get to know Jesus, the Saviour-King.

#LET'S SHARE

READ LUKE 2:8-20

"ALL WHO HEARD IT WERE AMAZED AT WHAT THE SHEPHERDS SAID TO THEM."

#SHARE YOUR FAITH STORY

What is all the verbs (actions) in verses 15-20? What clues do these words give you about the ways in which you can share your God-story?

What do you know about other religions? Imagine sitting in a bus next to someone of a different faith. How would you start a conversation with him/her?

The shepherds were poor and uneducated. They were busy looking after their sheep, but this did not stop them from sharing. What excuses do you hide behind for not sharing the good news of Jesus?

You are the Hope to Others (H20) - Be inspired by other's testimonies. Visit "yesHeis", "lamsecond" or "imaginemovement" on YouTube. What is your testimony?



JESUS OUR FRIEND

READ JOHN 15:9-17 "I HAVE CALLED YOU FRIENDS."

CHAT:

- How does Jesus describe the love He has for us as his disciples?
- Read verse 15 again. What is the difference between a friendship and a master-servant relationship?
- This passage challenges us to not only befriend people we like. What implications does this have for you?

THINK:

- What does it mean to you that Jesus is your friend?
- Our choice of friends say a lot about who we are. Think about a time when you were surprised by friendship.

MAKE WAVES:

Did you know that October is Mental Health Awareness Month. Over 50% of 15- to 18-year-old teenagers experience elevated levels of depression symptoms, while more than 30% of teenagers aged between 10 and 14 are impacted, mainly because they feel lonely and not good enough.

- During break time at school, take turns to sit with different groups. Keep your eyes open for someone who is all by themselves and go talk to them.
- Make a deliberate decision to befriend someone from a different culture in your class. Go and visit them at their home and invite them to yours.

#LET'S BEFRIEND

READ JOHN 15:9-17 "MY COMMAND IS THIS: LOVE EACH OTHER AS I HAVE LOVED YOU."

How you treat your friends (and they you) is important. Bring Hope to Others (H20) by investing in healthy friendships.

- Do you have anything in your life that keeps you "imprisoned"?
- What makes you feel powerless or stressed?

MAKE WAVES:

We see a world where people are free from addiction and slavery. Did you know in 2023, the South African Anxiety and Depression Group (SADAG) found that the average age for drug dependency in SA is 12, whilst half of the country's teenagers also used alcohol.

 What are all the forms of addiction and opression which you can think of?



JESUS MY HEALER

READ LUKE 17:11-19 "JESUS, MASTER, HAVE PITY ON US!"

CHAT:

- What do you know about leprosy?
- What do you think is our modern-day leprosy?
- We easily ignore people we walk by on the streets. Why did Jesus stop and interact with these lepers despite the fact that the law labelled them as unclean?

THINK:

- Healing is not only about the physical; sometimes we need emotional healing as well. Where or when have you seen Jesus healing people, giving them hope, bringing them joy, changing their attitude or giving them a new sense of purpose?
- Name the areas in your life where you need Jesus' healing? Pray about this with someone you trust.

MAKE WAVES:

We see a world where everyone has access to health care, clean water and sanitation. Did you know that in South Africa, adolescents aged 10-19 represent a significant proportion of the population at 17,4% and contribute to 2,1% of the total mortality. The leading causes of adolescent deaths are accidents, assaults, infectious diseases like respiratory diseases, tuberculosis and HIV as well as suicide.

 Jesus was able to make a difference in the lepers' lives, so He stopped and did so. When or where do you need to stop and make the time to make a difference?

#LET'S HEAL

READ LUKE 17:11-19 WHEN HE SAW HE WAS HEALED, HE CAME BACK, PRAISING GOD IN A LOUD VOICE."

In your community, name the group(s) of people that may not easily be received by the rest of the society (the people you often ignore). Be the

Hope to Others (H20) by #Serving at your local church.





JESUS MY TEACHER

READ MATTHEW 28:16-20 "THEREFORE, GO AND MAKE DISCIPLES OF ALL NATIONS."

CHAT:

- Describe the way that Jesus made disciples or modelled disciplemaking for his followers.
- How did He share, show, and teach the Gospel while serving the world?

THINK:

- What is Jesus teaching you at the moment?
- Jesus ends the passages with the words, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." What difference does Jesus' promise in his final sentence make in your life?

MAKE WAVES:

We dream of a world where everyone has opportunity to receive good education. Did you know that the first 1000 days of a child's live is the most important when it comes to brain and physical development? The first 1000 days are a period of intense physical and brain development, with the brain growing more rapidly than at any other time in a person's life.

- Make a list of all the teachers at your school. Take a few names each day and pray for them by name.
- Ask your friends, family, school or church to donate old stationary and basic school clothes and take it to a small rural school or other charities.

#LET'S TEACH

READ MATTHEW 28:16-20 "AND TEACHING THEM TO OBEY EVERYTHING ..."

For you to live out the "great commission" (the instruction) and bring **Hope to Others (H20)** every day and everywhere you go, what changes or commitments do you need to make?

Why don't you start at #Get a mentor or be a mentor? How to have mentorship conversations:

JESUS MY HELPER

READ MATTHEW 14:13-21 "HE HAD COMPASSION ON THEM."

CHAT:

- Why did Jesus choose not to send the people home, but to give them something to eat instead?
- What does it mean to you to know that Jesus sees your needs and that He has compassion for you?

THINK:

- In John 6:9 we read that the fish and bread was given by a boy who
 chose to give his little to feed a lot. What does this version of the
 story tell you about the way in which Jesus helps people?
- How is giving and providing for others something we ought to be doing in our lives as one of Jesus' disciples?

MAKE WAVES:

We see a world without poverty, injustice and unemployment. Did you know in the past year, 12% of children in South Africa (nearly 2.6 million) lived in households that reported child hunger. 53% of children (11.1 million) were poor in 2022, and 38% (7.9 million children) were below the food poverty line, meaning that they were not getting enough nutrition, making life very difficult.

- Go through your closet or room. Is there anything that you have two
 or more of, or things that you do not use anymore? Collect all the
 items and donate it to organisations (shelters, children's homes,
 local churches) that can use it.
- Take an extra sandwich to school and during break time, go sit with the buddy or group that is half on their own and share your snacks with them.

#LET'S SERVE

READ MATTHEW 14:13-21 "YOU GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO EAT."

Jesus told his disciples that they should give the crowd something to eat. Why do you think Jesus challenged them to do so? What is some of the needs you get challenged with in your community?

Be the Hope to Others (H20) by #Organising a local outreach.

Brainstorm ways where you can use the following to make a difference in your community.





JESUS MY PEACEMAKER

READ MATTHEW 5:38-48 "TURN TO THEM THE OTHER CHEEK ALSO."

CHAT:

- Look closely at verses 38–42. How does your natural response differ from this?
- Why does Jesus say we are to treat our enemies with love? Why is this extraordinary?
- Can you think of other stories in the Bible where Jesus put himself second?

THINK:

- What does it mean to you that Jesus is peace and gives you peace?
- Think of someone you can call or visit today to make peace.

MAKE WAVES:

We believe in a world free of hatred, violence and crime. In 2022/23, 19 418 reported cases of assault committed against children, making up about 45,0% of all reported crimes against children in this period. Although the number of incidents has decreased, it remains a significant concern due to its traumatic impact on young victims. You can make a difference.


- Bake cupcakes and take it to the local police station to show your support.


#LET'S MAKE PEACE


READ MATTHEW 5:38-48 "BE PERFECT, THEREFORE, AS YOUR HEAVENLY FATHER IS PERFECT."

- You can be the **Hope to Others (H2O)** by being a peace-maker and building bridges.























JESUS MY IGNITER

READ MARK 1:16-20 "AT ONCE THEY LEFT THEIR NETS AND FOLLOWED HIM."

CHAT:

- Jesus did not call the devoted Jewish leaders of that time to follow Him. He called ordinary people with no special training, but who were willing. What does this say to you?
- The disciples had left their jobs and families to follow Jesus. Why do you think they did it?

THINK:

- What are some obstacles people face today when deciding to passionately follow Jesus?
- Where in your life do you lack passion for Jesus? Share this with Jesus and ask Him to ignite your passion.

MAKE WAVES:

We see a world where young people take initiative to solve problems. Did you know that often the young people of South Africa are spoken about and not spoken to regarding their dreams. 34% of South Africans are under the age of 18. You have a voice, take up your space and make some waves!

- Only through action do words take meaning. Think about all the things in your community that you and your friend complain about. Make a list.
- Choose one issue on your list. How can you take action? (See the action stations for more ideas.)

#LET'S IGNITE

READ MARK 1:16-20

"COME, FOLLOW ME," JESUS SAID, "AND I WILL SEND
YOU OUT TO FISH FOR PEOPLE."

Trace your own feet as a sign of God choosing to befriend you OR follow footprints to the cross and thank God for being your friend.

JESUS MY HELPER

Take a small piece of bread (bite-sized) as a symbol of God helping you. While chewing the bread, pray about it.



Untie a knot in a rope to remember that God sets us free. Ask God to set you free from whatever is holding you back from worshipping Him with all that you have.


